Let's talk turtles!

Wednesday May 2 (rain date May 3)

6:30 p.m. at the CCC open house

The turtle group is part of the Friends of the Kingston Inner Harbour who have come together to protect the turtles in the area. They advocate for habitat measures, increase public awereness, save nests and work with

citizens to implement monitoring programs.

The inner harbour is an important area for at least 3 turtle species. but wo of these are species at risk. Threats to the turtles are increasing through shoreline developments and road proposals, in addition to the existing threats of predation, pollution, boat strikes, road deaths, and other human activities.

This talk will help our members become more aware of the turtles, and their importance and become allies in their protection. Canoeists and kayakers are out on the water and the shoreline regularly and see the shore and water from a different perspective, enjoying the more natural surroundings that this area offers. The project will include an educational talk by turtle naturalists. Official turtle identification materials will be distributed at these events and available through the club at other times as well.



An exciting four day paddle from CCC Boathouse to Smiths Falls paddling on our local UNESCO World Heritage site, the historic Rideau Canal. The trip will be fully open to day trippers or one night stands. Steve is planning a fixed schedule so that day trippers can track the group down. Kayakers may choose to shuttle camping gear each day to avoid stowing it. Otherwise there will be five hours of paddling for approximately 25km daily, with no commuting time. SATURDAY AUGUST 4TH – EASY SHORT PADDLE FROM THE BOATHOUSE

Some people hesitate to join us on a scheduled paddle, fearing that it might be too demanding. This is intended to be an easy paddle. In calm conditions we can paddle along the shore to the Causeway (0.9km),

Macdonald Park (3km), Tett Centre (4.2km), Olympic Harbour (5.5km) to Ontario Park (6.7km). We could stop at any of the previous points mentioned. If there is wind of over 10km/hr then we do not want to be in the open water of the harbour. So we would head in the opposite direction along the Cataraqui River, bridge at Hwy 401 (5km) and to Kingston Mills (7km). Either way we would stop for lunch at the end, and return.

SATURDAY AUGUST 11TH – PUZZLE LAKE PADDLE

Come explore the rugged shorelines of two or three pristine lakes nestled among red granite ridges up to 30m high, marred by only 6 waterfront mansions. For a change, we shall skip Loyst Lake and paddle all the way around Puzzle Lake. Leisurely paddlers can keep pace with the fleet by shortcutting across any of several narrow bays. To ease congestion at the Gull-to-Puzzle portage, experienced paddlers will be urged not to wait until everybody has launched at the Gull-Creek put-in. Early portagers can explore the south bay of Puzzle Lake before we convene the whole fleet near the mouth of this bay.
