#### O.R.C.A. CERTIFICATION

Canoe club members who would like to hone their paddling skills with official certification, will be interested to know that Canadian Recreational Canoe Association (CRCA) has adopted the certification programme developed by the Ontario Recreational Canoe Association (ORCA).

CCC is fortunate to have Walter Sepic as a member who is a certified ORCA Level 3 Lakewater (flat water) Instructor. Depending on the number of requests and his availability, Walter is prepared to offer certification programmes to CCC members for \$50.00 a day. This is significantly below other commercial offerings, and would be an excellent opportunity for interested CCC members to increase their paddling expertise.

For example the 'basic' level, which is actually quite comprehensive, is divided into four sections, and these can be completed within two full days (approx. \$100). Walter has course descriptions available if you would like more information. He has reserved JULY 3,4 Tues. & Wed. and August 11,12 Sat. & Sun. for LEVEL 1, depending on demand. Level 2 could also be offered, depending on demand.

#### **EQUIPMENT RENTAL POLICY**

Use at Boathouse: A member may borrow a canoe or kayak, together with paddles and life jackets, without cost when the boathouse is open if used only in the vicinity of the boathouse and returned by the time the boathouse is closed. Use of this equipment is restricted if needed for lessons or specially organized functions. Racing canoes and kayaks should be used only with the permission of the coach by persons with racing memberships or by persons taking part in organized racing programs.

Club Trips: For a club-sponsored trip, a member may rent a recreational canoe or kayak with paddle and skirt (if available) for a moderate fee per day. No charge will be made for flotation bags installed with the canoe or kayak. Additional equipment such as life jackets and canoe paddles may be rented at minimal cost per day each. A member may rent equipment for the use of a non-member coming as a guest.

*Other Uses:* Equipment may be rented or borrowed in other circumstances only with the permission of the board.

**Record Book, Payment:** A member renting equipment should complete an entry in a record book to be maintained at the boarthouse. Payment for rental should be made by cheque payable to the club.

Care of Equipment: In renting equipment, the member agrees to exercise due care, and to repair or replace damaged or lost equipment.

**September 5 to September 26:** Paddling reverts to Wednesdays from 6 pm to dusk, depending on demand.


