#### **CHARLESTON LAKE**

veryone in our September, Cataraqui Canoe Club outing was promised spectacular views of cliffs, sheltered waters, and a maze of picturesque islands. It was delivered in spades. The skies cleared just as we arrived at the launch point at the Ministry of Natural Resources (MNR) dock in Charleston. Located at the north end of Charleston Lake, the charming little village

of Charleston is worth seeing for it's own sake.

We had 12 boats and 15 paddlers. The sky remained sunny all day and the winds were light. The water was exceedingly clear and the trees were approaching peak fall colours. We paddled from the village of Charleston along the cliffs on the north west side, south past Tallow bay to enter Donaldson Bay on the extreme west end. It is bordered by more high cliffs along it's length. The 1/2 mile portage to Red Horse Lake was pointed out. This is part of the canoe route from the boat launching ramp at Charleston Lake to the Visitor Center at Frontenac Park. We lunched on a small island at the north end of Donaldson Bay, then paddled




back past Tallow Bay and north through a maze of islands. We covered a total of 17 kilometres.

On the drive home, we stopped at Lyndhurst for ice cream and hot chocolate by one of the oldest and most beautiful bridges in Ontario.

Everyone present agreed that it was one of the best canoe trips of the year and should be repeated again.

To follow the route we took to Charleston, drive north on Highway 15, then at 5 kilometres past Seeleys

Bay, take the Lyndhurst Road northeast through Lyndhurst, turn right on the Lower Oak Leaf Road and drive to the end. The road will "T", keep bearing right to the public dock in the village. You won't see a road sign pointing to Charleston.

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# INTERESTED IN A ONE WEEK CAMPOUT IN KILLARNEY PROVINCIAL PARK? By Steve Manders

ould you enjoy a week long campout in Killarney Provincial Park, where the Group of Seven did a lot of their paintings? This is an exceedingly popular location with limited spaces available and needs to be booked as early as possible.

I can reserve a camp site on a given lake on a certain day, but not a specific site. They are limited to 9 people per site, but that is also variable, and depends on the number of tents too. Camp sites cannot be reserved more than 5 months in advance, and will go almost immediately. I am planning for the first full week after Labour Day. Crowds are down, bugs are gone, weather is generally good and the days are still long. What I need is an expression of interest in this trip so that I can make plans — which must be finalized by April 1, 2010. Many club members have already done this trip. You will need a light canoe which is easy to portage. We will not be running white water. Canoes can be rented on site too. There is a full day of driving each way to the park. If enough people want to go, we may be able to reserve two sites on each lake, or on adjacent lakes.

Change in activity may be necessary due to weather or water conditions. Check with the trip leader. Changes with enough lead time will be posted on the website version of the schedule: http://www.cataraquicanoe.on.ca/events.html.

IS THIS ACTIVITY RIGHT FOR ME? Is it within my limits of fitness and skill? Do I have the right clothing, footwear and equipment? What water, food and protectants should be included in my pack? What are the potential risks, and do I accept them? Is there a health problem that could affect my participation? Am I aware of strategies to minimise impact on the environment?

Your leader can help with these and other questions when you call, and at the same time describe the plan for the activity. Also, at the designated meeting place you will be required to read an outline of the activity and the anticipated risks, before signing a waiver. Good preparation and safety awareness on the part of each participant makes a trip less risky and more enjoyable for all.

There is a \$5 fee for non-members on paddling trips and overnight trips. Guests are welcome at no charge on non-paddling day trips.
