It's a story of adventure, murder, hope and redemption set in one of the most spectacular tundra river valleys in the world. See grizzly bears, Inuit games, caribou, and arctic char that are jumping into the boats!

Thursday, March 24, 7:00 p.m. - **The Voyageur Highway by Bark Canoe.** Join Bill Buxton, principal researcher for Microsoft Inc, as he retraces a very difficult journey taken by his Anglican minister father back in 1939 from Stanley Mission to Cumberland House via the day school in the Cree Community of Pelican Narrows, Saskatchewan. It's a story about what it's like to build and paddle a real birch bark canoe on the routes of the explorers and voyageurs. Change in activity may be necessary due to weather or water conditions. Check with the trip leader. Changes with enough lead time will be posted on the website version of the schedule: http://www.cataraquicanoe.on.ca/events.html.

IS THIS ACTIVITY RIGHT FOR ME? Is it within my limits of fitness and skill? Do I have the right clothing, footwear and equipment? What water, food and protectants should be included in my pack? What are the potential risks, and do I accept them? Is there a health problem that could affect my participation? Am I aware of strategies to minimise impact on the environment?

Your leader can help with these and other questions when you call, and at the same time describe the plan for the activity. Also, at the designated meeting place you will be required to read an outline of the activity and the anticipated risks, before signing a waiver. Good preparation and safety awareness on the part of each participant makes a trip less risky and more enjoyable for all.

There is a \$5 fee for non-members on paddling trips and overnight trips. Guests are welcome at no charge on non-paddling day trips.

Sat, Sun Feb 5-6, AL-GONQUIN PARK, SILENT LAKE We'll leave Kingston, the Saturday morning and ski Silent Lake for the day. At nightfall we'll meet together at a cabin for dinner, enjoy a hot tub and the evening festivities. Next day, Sunday, we ski the Leaf Lake trails in Algonquin
